ADEK Inspection

The week of 11-14 November we had our bi-annual ADEK inspection. We were very pleased with the outcome and with their comments, particularly with regards to the behaviour and attitude of our students. The inspection team was very impressed with how well spoken, polite and confident our students are. They commented that our students have "immaculate behaviour".

Although we do not have the final evaluation the following key areas were identified:

Key Areas of Strength

Improved achievement in English, mathematics and science

Students who are very strongly self motivated and responsible learners

Very skilled teaching, particularly in English medium subjects, at middle and high phases

The very effective implementation of the Nova Scotia curriculum to develop students' learning skills

Key Areas Identified for Improvement

Raise achievement in Arabic medium subjects

Improve children's transition into the approaches of the Canadian Curriculum through the KG phase Ensure that professional development and improvement activities have clear impact on improving the school

Also repeatedly throughout the feedback it was stressed that children come to school late and that we must seriously address punctuality. We have been working on this since the inspection and need your help and support in making sure that all students are ready to begin their day at school at 07:55.

They also commented that our school has improved "meteorically" in the past few years.

On the Sunday following the inspection all students and staff were rewarded and thanked by Ms Fatima with an ice cream! It was very much appreciated by all.
