Message to Students, Parents and Guardians of the 2017 Graduation Class

Most grade 12 students have completed and submitted their college and/or university applications.

Official transcripts are being sent directly by Nova Scotia Department of Education and Early Childhood Development (DOEECD) to colleges and universities for students who provided Ms. Marlene our guidance counsellor with the name and mailing addresses for their applications. Students are eligible for a maximum of 5 transcripts free of charge. Students are able to request additional transcripts using an online request payment site.

Students are responsible for tracking all of their communication with the colleges and /or universities. Students should be logging into the school sites daily to check for updates and application or document status reports. Schools directly communicate with students and it is imperative that they keep on top of their applications.

Once students receive a conditional acceptance from a school they should if applicable begin the application process for a **Visa Study Permit**. **This process can take up to 13 weeks.**

In order to study in Canada as an international student you may need a study permit. Canadian study permits are only issued after you have been accepted at a Canadian college, university or other accredited educational institution designated to receive international students.

Dalhousie University in Halifax, Nova Scotia
Dalhousie General Entrance Award program
(Deadline: March 15)

To be considered for entrance scholarships and bursaries, students must submit the General Entrance Award application. By submitting this one application, students are considered for the majority of all entrance scholarships and bursaries available at Dalhousie.

The following are a few examples of former scholarships that have been made available to international students.

- **Humber College International Entrance Scholarships:**

Humber has offered renewable full and partial tuition scholarships to NEW international students beginning classes in September and January of each year.

- **York University International Student Scholarship Program:**

International students who have had an excellent academic record and admitted to York University have been eligible for scholarships.

- **University of British Columbia Scholarships for International Students:**

UBC recognizes the academic achievement of outstanding students from around the world by devoting more than \$10 million CAD annually to awards, scholarships and other forms of financial assistance for international undergraduate students.

- See also **International Leader of Tomorrow Award** which recognizes international undergraduate students who demonstrate superior academic achievement, leadership skills, involvement in student affairs and

community service, recognized achievement in fields of endeavor.

- **Carleton University Entrance Scholarships for International Students:**

Carleton offers partial scholarships worth \$4,000 – \$16,000 to exemplary students who meet the admission average criteria of 80% and above.

- **University of Alberta, Vancouver Island University, University of Saskatchewan, University of Calgary, and many others have also offered scholarships and/or awards to international undergraduate students.**

Severe Allergy to Latex Products
