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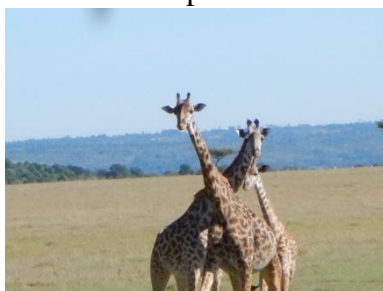
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Gudauri near the Caucasian mountains, where the students played in the snow and rode snowmobiles.

Following two years of planning, a group of dedicated students, teachers, parents, chaperones and a school administrator departed on an adventure of a lifetime in Kenya during Spring Break 2017- March 24-31. The group of 11 participated in a Me to We



organized trip to the Maasai Mara which is located six hours from Nairobi, Kenya. After landing in Nairobi on March 24 and spending a very nice night in a Me to We compound, the group made its way to the Maasai Mara. Upon arrival at our camp we were welcomed by all camp staff who were singing a Swahili "Welcome Song" in which our group joined in with great enthusiasm.



Our group was shown to our tent sites that proved to be very comfortable during our stay. The food was very enjoyed by all during our week at the Camp.

During the week we were guided by very capable Me to We staff including, Ms. Sahana (facilitator), Mr. Easy, Mr. Philip and Mr. Charles (Maasai Warriors) along with two high school graduates and many support staff in a very secure setting. The focus during the week was on the Me to We organization's five pillars including education, water, food, opportunity and healthcare.

During the week the group participated in many group sessions at the camp, visits to local schools and a hospital, participation in a "Water Walk" with Mamas, a beading session with Mamas, a visit to a local market to purchase food and other items for a week. An early morning Safari was a

highlight and enjoyed by all who viewed many zebras, gazelles, buffalo, hyenas, jackals as well as enormous giraffes and lions. Many everlasting pictures were taken! All took part in assisting with the construction of a new school building during an intensive work session that was temporarily delayed by heavy rain. Following the rain, everyone eagerly got back to work.

School visits to a KG - 8 (Emorijoi Primary School- 700 students) and 9-12 (Kisaruni - 150 students) school were really enjoyed by students. During our visit to **Emorijoi Primary School**, students were welcomed with singing by a group of grade 8 students. Our students and trip organizers reciprocated with a dancing presentation and a thank you. Students integrated with our host students and enjoyed participating in various games. A very interesting and informative visit took place with **Kisaruni Secondary School**, a grade 9-12 boarding school. Students at this school were up at 4:30 AM and had their first math class at 5:30 AM and continued their schooling until the evening. A very busy day indeed!

All students and adults were really impressed with the activities, interaction and educational benefits of this truly



educational experience. Student participants included Laith and Habiba, grade 7, Aicha, grade 8, Gabriel, grade 9, Yara and Amina, grade 10 and Fabian, grade 11.
