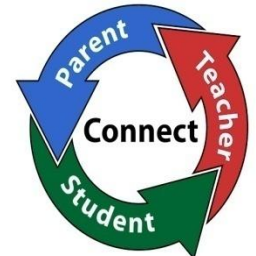

Language Arts and Integrated Mathematics. The other subjects (Core French, Health Education, Information & Communication Tech, Music, Physical Education, Science, Social Studies, and Visual Arts) will use the following developmental scale:

- Well Developed understanding and application of concepts and skills
- Developing as Expected with understanding and application of concepts and skills
- Needs Development with understanding and application of concepts
- Insufficient Evidence to report on achievement of the expected learning outcomes

These grades are written as WD, D, ND and INS. As in the past, most subjects will contain comments.

Nova Scotia Assessments Results

Recently we received the results of our Grade 8 and Grade 10 Assessment results from last year, 2015-16. We are very happy to report that our students are doing very well!

In Grade 8 our students did exceptionally well in Mathematics with 81% of our students being at or above the expectation for the end of Grade 8.

Our Language Arts results are unavailable due to insufficient evidence. Our students did not complete one section of the assessment making the results invalid.

In June of last year our students in Grade 10 wrote provincial examinations in English and Math. In English 80% of our students are meeting or exceeding expectations. In Math 73% are meeting or exceeding expectations.

We are extremely proud of our students and teachers for achieving such high standards on the Nova Scotia Provincial Assessments.

Canadian Tour of Universities:

Abu Dhabi Grammar School (Canada) was very fortunate to be able to host a Canadian Tour of Universities for high school students on October 31st. Students had the opportunity to speak with university representatives from more than fourteen Canadian universities and colleges who provided extensive information regarding courses, programs, degrees, and admission requirements. Meeting with admission officers permitted students the opportunity to put a name and a face to a school as well as ask questions about what is important to them. Having a personal "feel" for what a school is like is very helpful when making this important decision.



University & College Application Process:

Students can begin to focus on early applications for Canadian schools in November and December. Students applying to the UK

should be applying now.

All university applications should be completed by the end of first term. (February 2017).

Universities and colleges will need to see an official transcript of student marks. Transcripts are issued and sent

directly to post-secondary institutions by the Nova Scotia Department of Education & Early Childhood

Development (EECD). Students are eligible

for 5 transcripts free of charge. The Guidance Counselor will advise the Department of EECD on where to send students' transcripts. It is the students' responsibility to email Ms. Marlene the complete name and mailing address of the respective university. mjohns@agsgrmmr.sch.ca
